SESE Activity - History

The following resource has been designed based on the Food Dudes Week, intermediate level, day 5 video. This resource links with the History curriculum for 2nd, 3rd and 4th class groups.

This activity is linked to the following curricular areas:

2nd Class:

SESE > History > Myself and my family > When my Grandparents were young

3rd and 4th Class:

SESE > History > Local Studies > Feasts and Festivals in the Past

Key Learning Outcomes:

2nd Class Pupils should be enabled to:

- Explore and record aspects of the lives of people when his/her grandparents were young
- Listen to adults talking about their own past
- Collect and/or examine simple evidence in school or in a local museum
- Compare lives of people in the past with the lives of people today, noting differences and similarities

3rd and 4th Class Pupils should be enabled to::

- Become familiar with the origins and traditions associated with some common festivals in Ireland and other countries
 - local feasts and festivals
 - feasts and festivals celebrated by various members of the school and local community, including Christian, Hindu, Jewish, Muslim and other celebrations where appropriate
- Explore, discuss and record some of the ceremonies, stories, legends, poetry, music, dances and games associated with these feasts and festivals





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Teacher Guidelines:

This activity could be broken down as delivered across 4 lessons:

- Lesson 1 Family Interview
- Lesson 2 Halloween
- Lesson 3 Other Feasts and Festivals
- Lesson 4 Show and Tell

This 2nd Class Activity will require pupils to interview family members and therefore should be set in part as a homework activity, before presenting their stories to the wider class and incorporating a 'show and tell' element. Pupils whose grandparents or great-grandparents live far away, can be encouraged to complete the activity via phone or video call. The worksheet can be printed.

The 3rd and 4th Class Activity will require pupils to have access to encyclopaedia / books / the internet. If needed, it can be completed as a whole group activity using the whiteboard.


